

Grades 9-12 Visual Art Audition Overview and Requirements

Task #1 - (Rising Grades 9 through 12)

Students will have 45 minutes to demonstrate technical and creative skills in a single composition. The composition will be assessed and scored based on students' knowledge of skills and technique using a medium of choice. Mediums provided include; acrylic, oil, and watercolor paint, pencil, charcoal, colored pencil and marker.

• **Technical Skill**: Students will use a medium of their choice to draw an object from observation, demonstrating rendering skills and showing their knowledge of space, line, value and form.

• <u>Creativity</u>: Students will add to the observational composition, enhancing the artwork using their personal art making style and creative expression.

• <u>Artist Statement:</u> Students will write a short artist statement containing a minimum of five sentences. Students will need to include; what they made, how they made it and the meaning/message/purpose of their artwork.

Portfolio (Rising grades 9-12)

The high school portfolio (grades 9-12) must include at least 10 artworks with a minimum of 3 different mediums: 1 portrait (people or animals), 1 landscape (places), 2 observations (things), 6 artworks of your choice (1 free choice art work may be digital art). Each work must also include an Artist Statement along with it. The statement should include what the piece is, how it was made, and the meaning/message/purpose of the work.

Details

- Students must present artwork neatly in a folder or portfolio bag. No torn sketchbook pages or notebook paper
- Students may include artworks created for school assignments or on their own within the last two years
- Students may also choose to show any 3D artworks they have made jewelry, fibers, clay, found objects or metal
- Students may not include drawings/tracings of copyrighted material (i.e., Disney or Anime characters)
- Artist Statements can be hand written or typed and should be attached to each piece
